Menlo Kids encourages children from 3 years old to 5th grade to bring an offering as part of our worship. We have a "Giving Box" available in every classroom and encourage kids to place coins they bring for an offering into the box during singing time. We also tell kids that the offerings they bring to Menlo Kids specifically go to meet the needs of two kids from Peru that Menlo Church supports through the ministry of Compassion International. We show them photos of the two kids, Jeremy (9) and Lesly (7), and give them updates from Compassion International whenever they are available. This is just one example of how our kids ministry walks alongside our children to model an attitude of thanksgiving and worship.

While our Kids ministry supports Jeremy and Lesly, our church family supports other children through Compassion International. Our congregation currently supports over 1,000 children in Peru, Brazil, and the Dominican Republic.

Eating, talking, and praying in a community of both caregivers and those grappling with mental health issues, Jane found the strength, support, acceptance, and love she needed to cope. After some years, when the HELP leaders retired, Jane's love for the community encouraged her to step in to coordinate the ministry herself, leading the meeting each week.




